

## **COVID-19 RESPONSE & RECOVERY**

The Covid-19 Response & Recovery Fund was created in response to the dramatic increase in the need of services from our local organizations who provide community support to our most vulnerable members, while still being able to provide their day-to-day services. Funds were used to support services that included answering crisis calls, food & prescription deliveries, local pantries & emergency childcare for essential frontline workers.

## **HEALING ILLINOIS**

The Healing Illinois initiative provided an opportunity for residents across northwest Illinois that have been disproportionately impacted by Covid-19, to engage in meaningful dialogue about racial healing. A portion of these funds were used to facilitate belonging & equity conversations & trainings in partnership with Northern Illinois Center for Non Profit Excellence, that had a total attendance of over 2,400 participants.

## **EMERGENCY FOOD & SHELTER PROGRAM**

UWNI serves as the chair of the local emergency food & shelter board that receives funds from the national Emergency Food & Shelter Program to help supplement existing service organizations that meet critical emergency needs in Stephenson, Jo Daviess & Carroll counties. Recipients of funding include homeless shelters, food pantries, home delivered meals & other vital services that assist inividuals in crisis.

### **DOLLY PARTON IMAGINATION LIBRARY**

June 2020

At the end of the 2020/2021 Campaign, the Dolly Parton Imagination Library had 2,577 enrolled children, from age 0 to five in Stephenson, Jo Daviess & Carrol counties. That is 74% of the total elgible population of our service area!

The United Way of Northwest Illinois designated \$60,000 to this program as part of our Education Initiative

#### **HEALING ILLINOIS JANUARY 2020**





Healing Illinois is a bold statewide initiative that addresses and heals the harms caused by racism. This initiative supports creating community-centered, inclusive and safe spaces to talk about racial disparities and designing local solutions. It is a first step toward the larger mission of fighting poverty and ending racial inequality for all Illinoisans and was funded in partnership with the Chicago Community Trust and the Illinois Department of Human Services.
